## Stage One – The classroom

Shifting the direction and delivery of education to better suit our boys.

Following a long period of analysis and internal reflection SBHS has developed a curriculum delivery model that better suits the nature of boys' education, and specifically, the education of our boys, and even more specifically, the education of your boy. We have been working on the structure and implementation of this model for over a year, and now, following the release of the new NCEA standard alignment process, we are confident that we have developed the best system to ensure that your son achieves to his highest potential while at SBHS.

Here are the basic foundations that we wanted to build upon.

- Boys achieve the highest results in things that engage them and that they enjoy.
- The majority of boys work well in a team environment
- Boys like structure and practicality
- Education is a burden best shared
- All students encounter an aspect of their schooling that they struggle with
- All humans excel at something (most do not know, or are too shy to admit, what that is).
- The most difficult phase of the educational journey is from 13-15 years old, this is the point where the body's progress through puberty is at its most disruptive.
- The students of SBHS represent every aspect of Southland, they are diverse and that makes them unique.

To ensure that we are meeting each of these needs we have developed a new educational system for all Year 9 and 10 learners. We have named it a Hub system; this is because the best way to think about it is like a wagon wheel with a group of supportive spokes supporting the central 'hub'.

### **Here is how it will work.**

Your son will be placed in a Hub at the start of the year

The hub will be made up of students from a range of ability levels and will be named so that there is a common title that binds them all together.

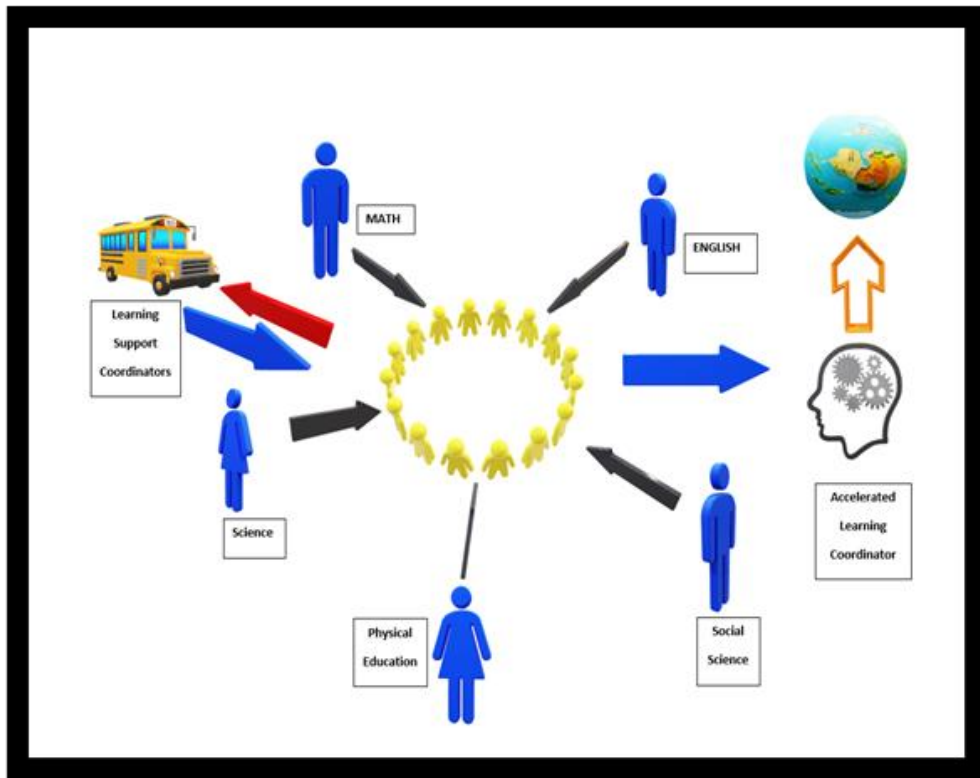




From the moment your son is placed in this Hub, he will be part of a team. The hub will work together, compete together and be a bonding group for the duration of the academic year. Unlike a homeroom this group will travel from class to class, but like a homeroom class, they will do it together.

### Stage two is the support stage

When the Hub is established it will be supported by five educational 'spokes'



The five Core teachers assigned to your son's Hub will work in concert to deliver an educational programme that identifies his diverse talents and seeks to enhance them. Likewise, the aspects of your son's education that he struggles with will be quickly identified, analysed and practical solutions sought and utilised. The five teachers will meet regularly and discuss the way your son is being taught in each class, his progress will be analysed and a 'best fit' model will be put in place. Outside the Hub we have two groups that will work on an 'on-call' basis, they are the Learning Support Coordinators and the Accelerant Learning Coordinator.

### Learning Support Coordinators

To ensure that your son's learning challenges are identified, and expert assistance is sought in a timeframe that enables him to make constant and consistent progress we have established the Learning Support Coordinators (LSCs). The five teachers within the Hub will identify learning barriers and then refer them to the LSC, once the referral has been made the LSC will run a diagnostic assessment based on the available data within the school network they will then develop a consultation plan that brings in expert help from outside the school (when required).



## Accelerant Learning Coordinator

Equally, we want to ensure that your son's talents/gifts are identified, and resources are put in place to help him further develop this talent to its truest potential. The Accelerant Learning Coordinator will carry out this role within the Hub system. The five teachers within the Hub will identify the gifts that your son exhibits and then refer them to the ALC who will develop extension programmes and make connections to other opportunities that will directly enhance the skill that your son has displayed. This will involve the ALC bringing in expert groups and individuals when required. As the five teachers represent the foundation of the educational experience, we will be able to identify gifts from a vast range of skill sets. Whanau will be involved throughout any referral process.

Throughout the year the Hubs will also work directly with the Careers Advisor to ensure that broad, but tailored, pathways are mapped out for each learner, this will assist in the decision making process that leads to the choice of NCEA subjects.

Your son will still undertake Option subjects from a full range of Technology, Language and Arts experts, these will work outside the Hub, but the information compiled within the Hub will be freely shared with Option teachers to ensure that your son's journey is carried through all learning areas within the school.

This is the first step onto the path of a truly flexible and individualised educational journey that will feed into the reshaping of NCEA from 2021 and into the future for your young man. It is a very exciting time to be in education. More than ever before, we are armed with a myriad of tools that when applied in an inclusive, team-based atmosphere, can ensure our boys stay firmly, on the path to success. For too long, education has been something that happens to people. In 2021 we will ensure that it is happening because of people, and your son will be at the center of that.

## Stage Two – School Culture

*By sharing a goal, we share a journey and build a bond.*

At SBHS we acknowledge the need to use competition to enhance the educational journey of our young men. This competition is not about winning and losing, rather, it is about sharing a goal and working together to achieve it. At a boys' school, this is most evident in the pursuit of the House Cup. This trophy is the only award that all students can contribute to winning. Therefore, the pursuit of this cup is a true bonding experience for the students at this school. In 2021 we are going to enhance this experience so that it encompasses the full educational experience for our boys.

### **Step One:**

Our Year 9-13 Tutor classes are going to shift to a vertical format, the students will be placed in a Tutor Class based on their House affiliations (eg. the students of Coldstream House will be separated into six Tutor Classes with students from all levels making up the group, likewise of the other four Houses). We will appoint a student leader to each Tutor Class who will be charged with building and maintaining the comradery and brotherhood within the Tutor Class (older looks after younger). Our Year 9 students will have a tangible role model within their daily education who can mentor them and look out for their needs.



### **Step Two:**

Our Deans will become House Deans, this way a bond can be built between the Dean and the students based on competition and a shared goal. The Dean will be a formative figure for each student throughout their education as they progress through the House ranks to a point where they will take on leadership responsibilities in the Senior school. This position will enhance the pastoral management responsibilities of the Dean as they will share experiences in the pursuit of the House Cup.

### **Step Three:**

We will make the House cup a true reflection of total effort from each student within the House. To this end each student will have the ability to win and lose House points throughout the year. We will award House points for all competitions (Athletics Day, Cultural competitions etc), students will also gain points for their house by individual effort. Outstanding effort in class and around the school will be acknowledged by the awarding of House points.

### **Step Four**

Leadership – we will be enhancing existing leadership positions and introducing new ones. The roles of Head boy and Deputy Head boy are 139 year old traditions at SBHS, in 2020 we introduced a level of visibility to the position by piping the blazers Red for the Head boy and White for the Deputy Head boy, this will continue as we appoint the 140<sup>th</sup> Head boy at prizegiving this year. The next step will be to enhance the position of Head of House. From 2021 onwards a boy will be selected from within his House to Lead the students throughout the year as they vie for the House Cup. This students Blazer will also be piped (pocket and sleeves (Orange for Coldstream, Black for Pearce, Dark Blue for Uttley, Green for Grant and Red for Deaker), this will ensure that the position of leadership is immediately visible to all who enter the school. We will also be acknowledging the power, mana and importance of the student chosen to lead the school haka. This person is vital in a boy's school as they are the face of the student body when we celebrate, when we mourn and when we commemorate. This position will be acknowledged with a ceremonial Mere which will be handed on to each successive leader at Prizegiving and acknowledge the holder as the Cultural center of the student body.

## **Stage Three – Structure of the day**

In 2021 we will be altering the way we approach each day. The shifts are aimed at maximizing the learning experience for each student while ensuring we meet the needs of our community. We are introducing transition times within the day to ensure each student knows when they are supposed to be in class and when they need to start the journey from where they are to where they need to be, these transition times will remove the arbitrary nature of 'lateness' and make it a measurable time that is governed by bells throughout the school. We have then removed all the 'dead time' from the structure of each day to ensure that we are making the most of every moment with our students. At all points within the day, we will be focusing on curriculum delivery, enhancing school spirit, enhancing house bonding and often all three at the same time.

## Stage Four – Accountability

One of the most vital things when educating young men is to ensure they fully understand the impact of their actions and decisions on those around them, they must also be acutely aware of how to rebuild a relationship in a positive way once it has been altered by a negative interaction. Therefore, our boys will be asked to answer three questions following an indiscretion.

***“What did I do?”***

***“Who was effected by my actions?”***

***“What do I need to do to rebuild the relationship that my actions altered?”***

We will then have a system in place to ensure that the reparation is manageable, personal, and aimed at building, rather than breaking.

**Stage One:** following an indiscretion, the students will carry out a detention or similar reparation with the person they had the negative interaction with. These will occur within the school day usually at lunchtimes or interval.

**Stage Two:** following repeated indiscretions or an indiscretion of a more concerning nature the student will carry out a detention where their reparation is to the school. This will involve collection of rubbish of some other service aimed at enhancing the nature, appeal and harmony within the school. Again, these detentions will occur during the school day – these will be governed by the teacher on duty during the assigned lunch break.

**Stage Three:** Where stages one and two prove unsuccessful, students will undertake a detention with the Senior Teaching staff. These detentions will take place on Fridays between 2:50pm and 3:15pm (they will not impact on a student’s ability catch a bus home). During these detentions’ students will be counselled on their actions and how they are impacting on the ability for other students to make the most of their educational experience.

Whanau will be contacted at each level of the system and kept up to date on their son’s self-management.

We thought it would be helpful to give you some information about the process for registering your son to play sport at Southland Boys’ High School for 2021.

All information is loaded on our SBHS Sports website, which you can access via the main school site, under the Sport tab <https://www.sbhs.school.nz/> The sports website has all the latest information including online registration forms, current sport draws, latest news, notices, photos and more. Please ensure you **download the Sporty NZ app**, available free via the App Store and Google Play – assign Southland Boys’ High as your organisation so you can keep up to date and don’t miss out on any notifications.

**When registrations open for a sport** - it is advertised in the window of the Sports office (located between the Junior Block and the Gym) and in the daily school notices. There will also be an alert sent to the Sporty NZ app advising users that registrations are open.

**To register your son to play** - either visit the website or the app and complete the online registration form ***before the closing date*** - you will need to complete payment via the online payment portal at the time of registration. Registration cannot be completed without payment.

While we do our best to ensure our boys don't miss out on any sport, the closing dates are set for a reason and we cannot accept late registrations - we will also endeavor to send out reminder alert notification via the Sporty NZ App to assist with this. If you have enough credit built up on your school account and wish to use that credit, you will need to contact the Sports' Office to register your son. Online registration forms cannot be completed without online payment.

Please note SBHS have a **"No Pay, No Play"** Policy for sport, which we're sure you can all appreciate, if you have any trouble meeting this requirement please contact the Sports Office to discuss this ***before*** the closing date.

**Sport Uniform** - All students are expected to have the SBHS PE Uniform which is to be worn when playing any sport or attending an event. Sometimes a team uniform is provided, in these instances the uniforms are most commonly assigned by the coach/manager and **MUST BE** handed back in on the last day of the season or after the last game. A charge will apply for any unreturned or damaged uniforms.
